Media Officer

Responsible for working within the Exec Committee and helping the SU team find new and exciting way to increase volunteering opportunities within the college.



International Officer

Responsible for working within the Exec Committee and SU team to bring positive change for our International students.

Advice Engagement Officer



Responsible for working within the Exec Committee and SU team to help create content for students relating to advice. Making sure all students are represented and have the information from BPCSU Advice strand.









Mature Student Officer

Be a student of the age 21 years or older. Responsible for working within the Exec Committee and helping SU staff team reach our mature students. Be responsible for organising mature student groups and encouraging mature students to participate. Provide a prospective on the issues facing mature students. Election Rules 2022-23

The returning officer shall be responsible for administering the elections and ensuring candidates are following the election regulations.

- 1. The BPCSU elections are subject to the law and college policies. Candidates and their campaign teams must not break the law or any college policy.
- 2. The election will be conducted in accordance with the BPCSU constitution and the Returning Officer's interpretation of these is final.
- 3. All students have the right to vote independently and without pressure from candidates or any other individual acting on their behalf.
- 4. Candidates cannot vote on behalf of others. If a student needs help they should ask a member of Union staff.
- 5. Votes are cast online. Any electrical device which can be used to vote will be classed as a Polling Station. Any signed area with vote her will be classed as a Polling Station. Candidates must not interfere with any Polling Station.
- 6. The BPCSU and Bournemouth and Poole College cannot endorse any candidate and serve solely to ensure the election is run freely and fairly.
- 7. Candidates Manifestos must conform to the guidance within the Nomination and Election Pack.
- 8. Election rules are decided by the Returning Officer. Candidates in breach of these rules are subject to penalties as decided by the Returning Officer. Such penalties can include, but not limited to; verbal warnings, written warnings and disqualification from the election.
- 9. Candidates may withdraw from the election at any point by informing the Returning Officer by sending an email to stewartb@bpc.ac.uk.
- 10. The Returning Officer reserves the right to postpone or stop the election at any time if they believe the election is not being conducted in a fair manner.





Voting Procedures

- 1. Voting will be done online at Polling Stations throughout the college and on your personal devices.
- 2. All members of the Union may vote by online vote.
- 3. Votes will be cast online. All students will have access to vote in either way that is deemed by the member as appropriate.
- 4. The votes will be counted by the "single transferable voting system".
- 5. Re-open nomination shall be a candidate for all positions.
- 6. The elections counts will be conducted by Union staff after the voting period is finished.

The Returning Officer is responsible for the final interpretation of the rules and procedures.

The Returning Officer will be Brian Stewart, Student Engagement Coordinator, Bournemouth and Poole College Students Union.

Some Hints On Getting Votes

So you're looking to get elected? Here are a few hints on getting your numbers up, and a few things to avoid.

TELL YOUR MATES

Seems obvious but telling everyone you know that you are running for the elections the better! Voting takes a few seconds of their time to tick a box and put in one of our ballot boxes or to click a button online. Every enrolled student at the college is eligible to vote! Tell your class. Tell someone else's class. Tell them to pass it on!

SOCIAL MEDIA

If you can make a poster, why not make a 'vote for me' like page on Facebook or twitter, perfect to add the link for the online voting. Make sure you are representing yourself and the college well and again everything linked is appropriate.

DESIGN AND PUT UP POSTERS

With our help printing we can plaster some 'vote for me' posters around the college. You can make it as simple or as creative as you want (as long as it is appropriate and non-offensive) full details in this pack.

DON'T(S)

The following has been tried, and then the candidates have been caught out and taken out of the running for elections so don't do the following...

- Reach into the ballot box and tamper with any of the ballot papers
- Take a stack of ballot papers, fill them in with your name and post them. All ballot boxes are monitored and all slips have to be filled in next to the box.
- Intimidate any of the other candidates or 'trash talk' them.
- Post anything online or in any other publication related to the election that could bring the proceedings into disrepute.
